


WHO IS INVOLVED?

The new Alde & Ore Community Partnership (AOCP) has been formed to work with the community to help deliver the Plan now that it has entered the implementation phase.

The new partnership involves the whole community, with every parish bordering the rivers represented together with County and District Councillors, businesses, the Water Management Board and local amenity organisations. The Partnership will also continue to work with national agencies including Natural England and the Environment Agency, and locally with Coastal Partnership East.

The Alde & Ore Estuary Trust (AOET), established in 2013, is registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) with the Charity Commission (No 1155115). Its role is to raise the funds needed, where government funds are not available, to deliver the Estuary Plan.

This will be achieved through a combination of donations, grants and charitable foundation awards that support flood and environmental defence work.

Contributions received from community supporters, however small, are also vital to this project. It was donations to the AOET that enabled a Business Case to be completed to secure the Government match funding to deliver the Phase 1 works within the plan. Further donations are urgently needed to complete Phase 2.

The East Suffolk Water Management Board (ESWMB) is a Flood Risk Management Authority with statutory powers to undertake works with technical support from the Water Management Alliance

The ESWMB carry the responsibility for implementation and delivery of the construction works for the upgrading the river walls in line with the resilience approach in the Estuary Plan
